Jeppesen NavData for cycle 1206, effective 31 May 2012, contains incorrect procedure identifiers for multiple departures at Benito Juarez Intl; Mexico City, Mexico (MMMX). On the following page is a list of affected procedures with the changes listed.

The below departure procedures have the initial compulsory reporting point VASOS removed. The initial turn point is now the D5.5 MEX DME fix and is located in the same position as VASOS was. The departure procedures were also upnumbered due to the removal of VASOS.
