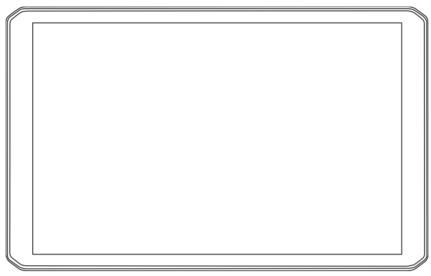

Mounting and Powering the Device in Your Vehicle

WARNING

This product contains a lithium-ion battery. To prevent the possibility of personal injury or product damage caused by battery exposure to extreme heat, store the device out of direct sunlight.

Both the device and its mount contain magnets. Under certain circumstances, magnets may cause interference with some internal medical devices and electronic devices, including pacemakers, insulin pumps or hard drives in laptop computers. Keep the device away from medical devices and electronic devices.

Before you use your device on battery power, you should charge it.

1 Open the lever ①, press the suction cup to the windscreen and flip the lever back towards the windscreen. The lever must be oriented towards the top of the windshield.



2 Plug the vehicle power cable 2 into the port on the mount.

3 If necessary, loosen the thumbscrew on the suction cup arm 3 and the nut on the ball mount 4, and adjust the mount for better viewing and operation.



- 4 Tighten the thumbscrew on the suction cup arm and the nut on the ball mount.
- 5 Place the device onto the magnetic mount.



6 Plug the other end of the vehicle power cable into a power outlet in your vehicle.

Installing the Screw-Down Mount on the Dashboard

Before you can attach the screw-down ball mount to your dashboard, you must select a suitable location on the dashboard.

⚠ WARNING

It is your responsibility to ensure the mounting location complies with all applicable laws and ordinances, and does not block your view of the road during the safe operation of your vehicle.

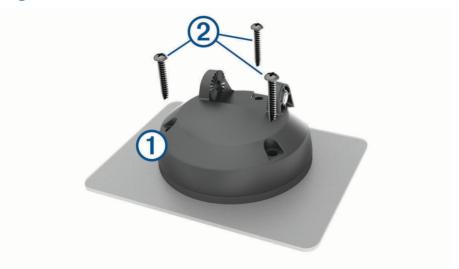
NOTICE

Avoid wires, gauges, air bags, air bag covers, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning and other items when drilling pilot holes and attaching the mount to the vehicle. Garmin® is not responsible for any damages or consequences arising from the installation.

NOTICE

Garmin recommends professional installation of the screw-down ball mount.

1 Place the mount 1 on the selected location.



- 2 Using the mount as a template, mark the three screw locations.
- 3 Drill pilot holes (optional).
 For some types of mounting material, drilling pilot holes is necessary.
- 4 Securely fasten the mount to the surface using the supplied screws 2.

5 Insert the ball mount arm 3 into the mount.



6 Insert the thumbscrew 4 into the mount and tighten it to secure the ball mount arm.

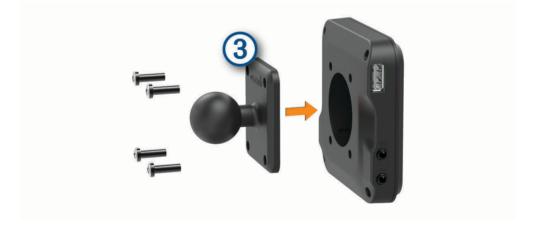
Installing the Ball Mount Adapter

Your device includes a one-inch ball mount that is compatible with third-party mounting solutions.

1 Remove the four screws 1 securing the mount socket 2 to the magnetic mount.



- 2 Remove the mount socket.
- 3 Secure the one-inch ball mount 3 to the magnetic mount using the screws removed in step 1.



Turning the device on or off

• To turn the device on, press the power key 1 or connect the device to power.



- To put the device in power saving mode, press the power key while the device is on.
 While in power saving mode, the screen is off and the device uses very little power, but it can wake instantly for use.
 - TIP: you can charge your device faster by putting it in power saving mode while charging the battery.
- To turn off the device completely, hold the power key until a prompt appears on the screen, then select Power
 Off.

Acquiring GPS signals

When you turn on your navigation device, the GPS receiver must collect satellite data and establish the current location. The time required to acquire satellite signals varies based on several factors, including how far you are from the location where you last used your navigation device, whether you have a clear view of the sky, and how long it has been since you last used your navigation device. The first time you turn on your navigation device, it may take several minutes to acquire satellite signals.

- 1 Turn on the device.
- 2 Verify ♥ appears in the status bar. Enable location services if it does not (*Enabling or Disabling Location Services*, page 59).
- 3 If necessary, go to an open area with a clear view of the sky, away from tall buildings and trees.

 Acquiring Satellites appears at the top of the navigation map until the device determines your location.

Home Screen

NOTE: the home screen layout may vary if it has been customised.



- Swipe down to view notifications.
 Swipe down twice to quickly change settings and backlight brightness.
- 2 Select to start a route.
- 3 Select to view the map.
- 4 Select to change your vehicle profile.
- 5 Select to view weather information for your current location. The dezl app is required.
- 6 Select to view smart notifications. The dezl app is required.
- Select to open the app drawer. The app drawer contains shortcuts to all the apps installed on your device.
- 8 Hold to customise the wallpaper or add widgets to the home screen.

Opening an App

The home screen contains shortcuts for frequently used apps. The app drawer contains all the apps installed on your device, organised into two tabs. The deltab contains Garmin apps which are useful for navigation, dispatching and hours of service recording. The Tools tab contains apps useful for communication and other tasks.

Select an option to open an app:

- Select an app shortcut from the home screen.
- Select ; select a tab and select an app.

Adding Shortcuts to the Home Screen

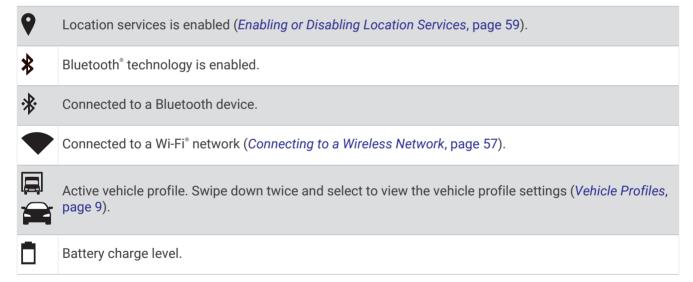
- 1 Select ...
- 2 Select an app tab to view additional applications.
- 3 Hold an application, and drag it to a location on the home screen.

Viewing Notifications

- 1 Swipe down from the top of the screen.
 - The list of notifications appears.
- 2 Select an option:
 - To launch the action or app mentioned in the notification, select the notification.
 - · To dismiss a notification, swipe the notification to the right.

Status bar icons

The status bar is located at the top of the main menu. The status bar icons display information about features on the device.



Using the Touchscreen

- · Tap the screen to select an item.
- · Drag or swipe your finger across the screen to pan or scroll.
- · Pinch two fingers together to zoom out.
- · Spread two fingers apart to zoom in.

Adjusting the screen brightness

The device can use an ambient light sensor to adjust the screen brightness to your vehicle conditions automatically (*Display settings*, page 58). You can also adjust the brightness manually using either the notification panel or the settings menu.

- 1 Select an option:
 - · Swipe down twice from the top of the screen to expand the guick settings in the notification panel.
 - Select Settings > Device > Display > Brightness Level.
- 2 Use the slider bar to adjust the brightness.

Vehicle Profiles

↑ WARNING

Entering your vehicle profile characteristics does not guarantee that your vehicle's characteristics will be accounted for in all route suggestions or that you will receive the warning icons in all cases. Limitations may exist in the map data such that your device cannot account for these restrictions or road conditions in all cases. Always defer to all posted road signs and road conditions when making driving decisions.

Routing and navigation are calculated differently based on your vehicle profile. The activated vehicle profile is indicated by an icon in the status bar. The navigation and map settings on your device can be customised separately for each vehicle type.

When you activate a lorry vehicle profile, the device avoids including restricted or impassable areas in routes based on the dimensions, weight, and other characteristics you entered for your vehicle.

Adding a vehicle profile

You can add a vehicle profile that includes the weight, dimensions, and other characteristics for your vehicle.

- 1 From the home screen, select the vehicle profile widget (*Home Screen*, page 7).
- 2 Select an option:
 - To add a straight lorry with a permanently attached cargo area, select Straight Lorry.
 - To add a tractor or a tractor-trailer combination, select Articulated Lorry.
 - · To add a bus, select Bus.
- 3 Follow the on-screen instructions to enter the vehicle characteristics.

After you add a vehicle profile, you can edit the profile to enter additional detailed information, such as the vehicle identification number or trailer number (*Editing a vehicle profile*, page 10).

Car Profile

The car profile is a preloaded vehicle profile intended for use in an automobile without a trailer. While using the car profile, the device calculates standard automobile routes, and routing for large vehicles is not available. Some features and settings specific to large vehicles are not available while using the car profile.

Switching the Vehicle Profile

Each time you turn on your device, it prompts you to select a vehicle profile. You can manually switch to another vehicle profile at any time.

- 1 Select an option:
 - Swipe down twice from the top of the screen and select the vehicle profile icon, such as 🗐 or 🚘.
 - From the home screen, select the vehicle profile widget (Home Screen, page 7).
- 2 Select a vehicle profile.

The vehicle profile information appears, including measurements and weight.

3 Select Select.

Vehicle Profiles 9

Changing your trailer information

Before you can change your trailer information, you must enter a vehicle profile for a tractor (Adding a vehicle profile, page 9).

When you change the trailer on your lorry, you can change the trailer information in your vehicle profile without changing the lorry information. You can switch quickly between frequently used trailers.

- 1 From the home screen, select the vehicle profile widget (*Home Screen*, page 7).
- 2 Select the lorry vehicle profile to use with the trailer.
- 3 Select \bigcirc
- 4 Select an option:
 - · To use a recent trailer configuration, select a trailer configuration from the list.
 - To enter a new trailer configuration, select New Configuration, and enter the trailer information. New Configuration

Editing a vehicle profile

You can edit a vehicle profile to change vehicle information or to add detailed information to a new vehicle profile, such as the vehicle identification number, trailer number or odometer reading. You can also rename or delete a vehicle profile.

- 1 From the home screen, select the vehicle profile widget (Home Screen, page 7).
- 2 Select the vehicle profile to edit.
- 3 Select an option:
 - To edit the vehicle profile information, select \(\infty \) and select a field to edit.
 - To rename a vehicle profile, select > = > Rename Profile.
 - To delete the vehicle profile, select > **Delete**.

10 Vehicle Profiles

Driver awareness features and alerts

↑ CAUTION

The driver alerts and speed limit features are for information only. They do not replace your responsibility to abide by all posted speed limit signs and to use safe driving judgement at all times. Garmin is not responsible for any traffic fines or citations that you receive for failing to follow all applicable traffic laws and signs.

Your device provides features that can help encourage safer driving and increase efficiency, even when you are driving in a familiar area. The device plays an audible tone or message and displays information for each alert. You can enable or disable the audible tone for some types of driver alerts. Not all alerts are available in all areas.

Schools: the device plays a tone and displays the distance to and speed limit (if available) for an upcoming school or school zone.

Speed limit reduction: the device plays a tone and displays the upcoming reduced speed limit so you can be prepared to reduce your speed.

Speed limit exceeded: the device plays a tone and displays a red border on the speed limit icon when you exceed the posted speed limit for the current road.

Speed limit change: the device plays a tone and displays the upcoming speed limit so you can be prepared to adjust your speed.

Level crossing: the device plays a tone and displays the distance to an upcoming level crossing.

Animal crossing: the device plays a tone and displays the distance to an upcoming animal crossing area.

Bends: the device plays a tone and displays the distance to a curve in the road.

Slower traffic: the device plays a tone and displays the distance to slower traffic when you approach slower traffic at a higher speed. Your device must be receiving traffic information to use this feature (*Traffic*, page 36).

No lorries allowed: the device plays a tone when you approach a road where no lorries are allowed.

Risk of grounding: the device plays a tone and displays a message when you approach a road where your vehicle could become grounded.

Lateral wind: the device plays a tone and displays a message when you approach a road where there is risk of lateral wind.

Narrow road: the device plays a tone and displays a message when you approach a road that may be too narrow for your vehicle.

Steep hill: the device plays a tone and displays a message when you approach a steep hill.

County and country borders: the device plays a tone and displays a message when you approach the border of a country or country.

Enabling or Disabling Driver Alerts

You can enable or disable several types of driver alerts.

- 1 Select Settings > Driver Assistance > Audible Driver Alerts.
- 2 Select or clear the tick box next to each alert.

Red light and speed cameras

NOTICE

Garmin is not responsible for the accuracy of or the consequences of using a red light or speed camera database.

NOTE: this feature is not available for all regions or product models.

Information about red light and speed camera locations is available in some areas for some product models. The device alerts you when you approach a reported speed or red light camera.

- In some areas, your device can receive live red light and speed camera data while connected to a smartphone running the dezl app.
- You can use the Garmin Express[™] software (garmin.com/express) to update the camera database stored on your device. You should update your device frequently to receive the most up-to-date camera information.

Navigating to your destination

Routes

A route is a path from your current location to one or more destinations.

- The device calculates a recommended route to your destination based on the preferences you set, including the route calculation mode (Changing the route calculation mode, page 17) and avoidances (Avoiding Delays, Tolls and Areas, page 18).
- The device can automatically avoid roads that are not appropriate for the active vehicle profile.
- You can start navigating to your destination quickly using the recommended route, or you can select an alternative route (*Starting a route*, page 12).
- If there are specific roads you need to use or avoid, you can customise the route (*Shaping Your Route*, page 17).
- You can add multiple destinations to a route (Adding a location to your route, page 17).

Starting a route

- 1 Select Where To?, and search for a location (Finding and saving locations, page 20).
- 2 Select a location.
- 3 Select an option:
 - · To start navigating using the recommended route, select Go!.
 - To choose an alternative route, select and select a route.
 Alternative routes appear to the right of the map.
 - To edit the course of the route, select
 ✓ > Edit Route and add shaping points to the route (Shaping Your Route, page 17).

The device calculates a route to the location and guides you using voice prompts and information on the map (*Your route on the map*, page 13). A preview of the major roads in your route appears at the edge of the map for several seconds.

If you need to stop at additional destinations, you can add the locations to your route (*Adding a location to your route*, page 17).

Starting a route by using the map

You can start a route by selecting a location from the map.

- 1 Select View Map.
- 2 Drag and zoom the map to display the area to search.
- 3 Select a point, such as a street, junction or address location.
- 4 Select Go!.

Going home

The first time you start a route home, the device prompts you to enter your home location.

- 1 Select Where To? > Go Home.
- 2 If necessary, enter your home location.

Editing your home location

- 1 Select Where To? > == > Set Home Location.
- 2 Enter your home location.

Your route on the map

As you travel, the device guides you to your destination using voice prompts and information on the map. Instructions for your next turn or exit, or other actions appear across the top of the map.



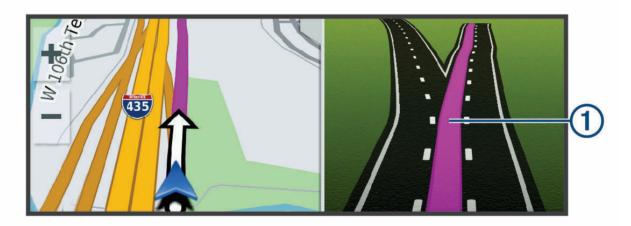
- 1 Distance to the next action.
- Next action in the route. Indicates the next turn, exit, or other action and the lane in which you should travel, if available.
- 3 Name of the street or exit associated with the next action.
- Route highlighted on the map.
- (5) Next action in the route. Arrows on the map indicate the location of upcoming actions.
- 6 Select to toggle popular lorry routes on the map.
- 7 Map tool shortcuts.
- 8 Map tools. You can select the tools to show you more information about your route and surroundings.

Data fields.

- (9) **TIP:** you can touch these fields to change the information they show (*Changing the map data field*, page 32).
- (10) Vehicle speed.

Active lane guidance

As you approach some turns, exits, or interchanges in your route, a detailed simulation of the road appears beside the map, if available. A coloured line ① indicates the proper lane for the turn.



Viewing Popular Lorry Paths on the Map

You can enable the device to highlight popular lorry paths on the map. This can be useful to help you choose roads that are more accessible for your vehicle.

From the map, select $\frac{1}{2}$.

Viewing turns and directions

While navigating a route, you can view next turns, lane changes, or other directions for your route.

- 1 From the map, select an option:
 - To view next turns and directions as you navigate, select > Turns.
 The map tool displays the next several turns or directions beside the map. The list updates automatically as you navigate the route.
 - To view the complete list of turns and directions for the entire route, select the text bar at the top of the map.
- 2 Select a turn or direction (optional).

Detailed information appears. An image of the junction may appear for junctions on major roads, if available.

Viewing the Entire Route on the Map

- 1 While navigating a route, select anywhere on the map.
- 2 Select [8].

Arriving at your destination

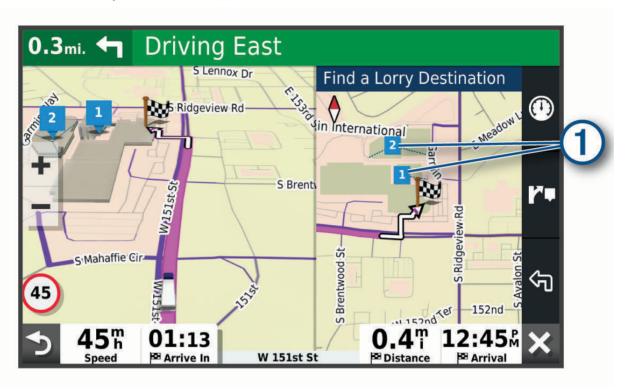
When you approach your destination, the device provides information to help you complete your route.

- Windicates the location of your destination on the map, and a voice prompt announces you are approaching your destination.
- When you approach some destinations, the device automatically suggests parking areas. You can select More to view a full list of suggested parking areas (*Parking Near Your Destination*, page 16).
- When you approach some destinations while using a lorry vehicle profile, the device automatically prompts you to find a lorry destination such as a loading dock or lorry parking. You can select a suggested point on the map and then select Go! to navigate to that destination.
- When you stop at your destination, the device automatically ends the route. If the device does not detect your arrival automatically, you can select Stop to end your route.

Completing a Lorry Route

When you approach some lorry destinations, a map tool appears to help you find common lorry destinations such as parking areas and loading docks.

1 Select a numbered lorry use destination 1.



2 Select Go!.

Parking Near Your Destination

Your device can help you find a parking spot near your destination. When you approach some destinations, the device automatically suggests parking areas.

NOTE: this feature should be used only when you are using the car vehicle profile. While using a lorry vehicle profile, you can search for lorry parking near your destination (*Finding lorry parking*, page 24).

- 1 Select an option:
 - When the device suggests parking, select More to see all suggested parking areas.
 NOTE: when you select a suggested parking area, the device automatically updates your route.
 - If the device does not suggest parking locations, select Where To? > Categories > Parking, and select ♥ > My Destination.
- 2 Select **Filter Parking** and select one or more categories to filter parking by availability, type, price or payment methods (optional).
 - **NOTE:** detailed parking data is not available in all areas or for all parking locations.
- 3 Select a parking location and select Go!.

The device guides you to the parking area.

Changing Your Active Route

Adding a location to your route

Before you can add a location to your route, you must be navigating a route (Starting a route, page 12).

You can add locations to the middle or end of your route. For example, you can add a petrol station as the next destination in your route.

TIP: to create complex routes with multiple destinations or scheduled stops, you can use the trip planner to plan, schedule and save a trip (*Planning a trip*, page 54).

- 1 From the map, select >> Where To?.
- 2 Search for a location (Finding and saving locations, page 20).
- 3 Select a location.
- 4 Select Go!.
- 5 Select an option:
 - · To add the location as the next destination in your route, select Add As Next Stop.
 - To add the location to the end of your route, select Add as Last Stop. Add As Last Stop.
 - To add the location and edit the order of destinations in your route, select Add to Active Route.

The device re-calculates the route to include the added location and guides you to the destinations in order.

Shaping Your Route

Before you can shape your route, you must start a route (Starting a route, page 12).

You can manually shape your route to change its course. This allows you to direct the route to use a certain road or go through a certain area without adding a destination to the route.

- 1 Select anywhere on the map.
- 2 Select Shape Route.

TIP: you can select **+** to zoom in on the map and select a more precise location.

The device enters route-shaping mode and recalculates the route to travel through the selected location.

- 3 Select Go!.
- 4 If necessary, select an option:
 - To add more shaping points to the route, select additional locations on the map.
 - To remove a shaping point, select the shaping point and select **Remove**.

Taking a detour

You can take a detour for a specified distance along your route or detour around specific roads. This is useful if you encounter construction zones, closed roads or poor road conditions.

- 1 From the map, select : > Edit Route.
- 2 Select an option:
 - To re-route for a specific distance, select **Detour by Distance**.
 - · To detour around a specific road on the route, select **Detour by Road**.

Changing the route calculation mode

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Calculation Mode.
- 2 Select an option:
 - Select Faster Time to calculate routes that are faster to drive, but can be longer in distance.
 - Select **Off Road** to calculate point-to-point routes (without roads).

Stopping the route

- From the map, select : > Stop.
- · From the home screen, select Stop.

Using Suggested Routes

Before you can use this feature, you must save at least one location and enable the travel history feature (*Navigation settings*, page 57).

Using the myTrends[™] feature, your device predicts your destination based on your travel history, the day of the week and the time of day. After you have driven to a favourite location several times, the location may appear in the navigation bar on the map, along with the estimated time of travel and traffic information.

Select the navigation bar to view a suggested route to the location.

Avoiding Delays, Tolls and Areas

Avoiding traffic delays on your route

Before you can avoid traffic delays, you must be receiving traffic information (Receiving traffic data using your smartphone, page 36).

By default, the device optimises your route to avoid traffic delays automatically. If you have disabled this option in the traffic settings (*Traffic Settings*, page 58), you can view and avoid traffic delays manually.

- 1 While navigating a route, select : > Traffic.
- 2 Select Alternative Route, if available.
- 3 Select Go!.

Avoiding toll roads

Your device can avoid routing you through areas that require tolls, such as toll roads, toll bridges, or congestion areas. The device may still include a toll area in your route if no other reasonable routes are available.

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation.
- 2 Select an option:

NOTE: the menu changes based on your area and the map data on your device.

- · Select Toll Roads.
- · Select Tolls and Fees > Toll Roads.
- 3 Select an option:
 - To be asked each time before routing through a toll area, select Always Ask.
 - · To always avoid tolls, select Avoid.
 - · To always allow tolls, select Allow.
- 4 Select Save.

Avoiding toll stickers

If the map data on your device contains detailed toll sticker information, you can avoid or allow roads that require toll stickers for each country.

NOTE: this feature is not available in all areas.

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Tolls and Fees > Toll Stickers.
- 2 Select a country.
- 3 Select an option:
 - · To be asked each time before routing through an area that requires toll stickers, select Always Ask.
 - · To always avoid roads that require toll stickers, select Avoid.
 - · To always allow roads that require toll stickers, select **Allow**.
- 4 Select Save.

Avoiding road features

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Avoidances.
- 2 Select the road features to avoid on your routes, and select OK.

Avoiding environmental zones

Your device can avoid areas with environmental or emissions restrictions that may apply to your vehicle. This option applies to the vehicle type in the active vehicle profile (*Vehicle Profiles*, page 9).

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Environmental Zones.
- 2 Select an option:
 - · To be asked each time before routing through an environmental zone, select Always Ask.
 - To always avoid environmental zones, select Avoid.
 - · To always allow environmental zones, select Allow.
- 3 Select Save.

Custom Avoidances

Custom avoidances allow you to select specific areas or sections of road to avoid. When the device calculates a route, it avoids these areas and roads unless no other reasonable route is available.

Avoiding a road

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Custom Avoidances.
- 2 If necessary, select Add Avoidance.
- 3 Select Add Avoid Road.
- 4 Select the starting point of the section of road to avoid and select Next.
- 5 Select the ending point of the road section and select Next.
- 6 Select Done.

Avoiding an area

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Custom Avoidances.
- 2 If necessary, select Add Avoidance.
- 3 Select Add Avoid Area.
- 4 Select the upper left corner of the area to avoid and select Next.Next
- 5 Select the lower right corner of the area to avoid and select Next.Next The selected area is shaded on the map.
- 6 Select Done.

Disabling a custom avoidance

You can disable a custom avoidance without deleting it.

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Custom Avoidances.
- 2 Select a created avoidance.
- 3 Select => Disable.

Deleting custom avoidances

- 1 Select Settings > Navigation > Custom Avoidances > III.
- 2 Select an option:
 - To delete all custom avoidances, select Select All > Delete.
 - To delete one custom avoidance, select the avoidance and select **Delete**.

Finding and saving locations

The maps loaded in your device contain locations, such as restaurants, hotels, vehicle services, and detailed street information. The Where To? menu helps you find your destination by providing several methods to browse, search, and save this information.

From the main menu, select Where To?.

- To quickly search all locations on your device, select **Qsearch** (Finding a location using the search bar, page 21).
- To find an address, select **Address** (Finding an address, page 21).
- To browse or search pre-loaded points of interest by category, select **Categories** (*Finding a location by category*, page 21).
- To search near a different town or area, select ♥ next to the current search area (Changing the search area, page 23).
- To view and edit your saved locations, select **Favourites** (Saving Locations, page 26).
- To view locations you have recently selected from the search results, select History (Viewing history, page 25).
- To search for lorry stops and services, select **Categories** > **Lorry Use** (*Finding lorry use points of interest*, page 20).
- To browse and search Foursquare® points of interest, select Foursquare (Searching Foursquare points of interest, page 25).
- To browse and search Tripadvisor® traveller ratings, select TripAdvisor (Tripadvisor, page 25).
- To navigate to specific geographic coordinates, select **Coordinates** (*Finding a location using coordinates*, page 24).

Points of Interest

A point of interest is a place that you may find useful or interesting. Points of interest are organised by category and can include popular travel destinations such as petrol stations, restaurants, hotels, and entertainment venues.

Finding lorry use points of interest

The detailed maps loaded on your device contain lorry use points of interest, such as motorway services, roadside services and weighbridges.

Select Where To? > Categories > Lorry Use.

Finding a location using the search bar

You can use the search bar to search for locations by entering a category, brand name, address or town name.

- 3 Enter all or part of the search term.

Suggested search terms appear below the search bar.

 - To search using the text you entered, select Q.
- 6 If necessary, select a location.

Finding an address

NOTE: the order of the steps may change depending on the map data loaded on your device.

- 3 Select Address.
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions to enter address information.
- 5 Select the address.

Finding a location by category

- 4 Select a location.

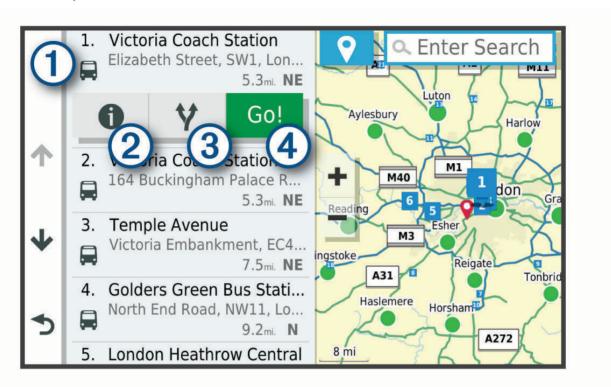

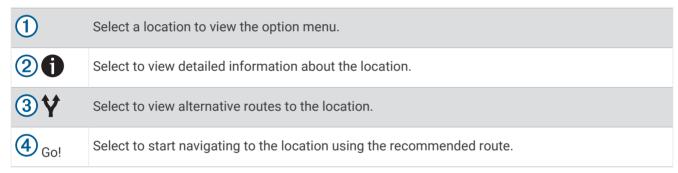

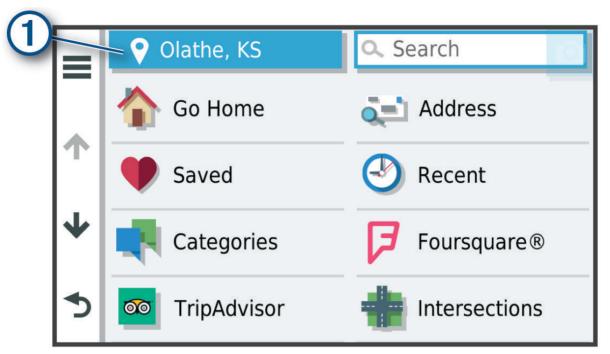




Changing the search area

By default, the device searches for locations near your current location. You can also search other areas, such as near your destination, near another city, or along your active route.

Understanding Parking Colours and Symbols

Parking locations that include detailed parking data are colour-coded to show the likelihood of finding parking. Symbols indicate the type of parking available (street or car park), relative pricing information and payment type. You can view the legend for these colours and symbols on the device.

From the parking search results, select 1

Search tools

Search tools allow you to search for specific types of locations by responding to on-screen prompts.

Finding a junction

You can search for a junction between two streets, motorways, or other roads.

- 1 Select Where To? > Junctions.
- **2** Follow the on-screen instructions to enter street information.
- **3** Select the junction.

Finding a location using coordinates

You can find a location using latitude and longitude coordinates. This can be helpful when geocaching.

- 1 Select Where To? > Coordinates.
- 2 If necessary, select , and change the coordinate format or datum.
- 3 Enter the latitude and longitude coordinates.
- 4 Select View on Map.

Foursquare

Foursquare is a location-based social network. Your device includes millions of pre-loaded Foursquare points of interest, which are indicated by the Foursquare logo in your location search results.

Searching Foursquare points of interest

You can search for Foursquare points of interest loaded on your device.

Select Where To? > Foursquare.

Viewing Foursquare location details

You can view Foursquare location information and user ratings.

- 1 From the location search results, select a Foursquare point of interest.
- 2 Select 1.

Tripadvisor

Your device includes Tripadvisor points of interest and ratings. Tripadvisor ratings appear automatically in the search results list for applicable points of interest. You can also search for nearby Tripadvisor points of interest and sort by distance or popularity.

Finding Tripadvisor points of interest

- 1 Select Where To? > TripAdvisor.
- 2 Select a category.
 - A list of nearby Tripadvisor points of interest for the category appears.
- 3 Select Sort Results to sort the search results by distance or popularity (optional).

Viewing history

Your device stores a history of the last 50 locations you have found.

Clearing the list of recently found places

Viewing current location information

You can use the Where Am I? page to view information about your current location. This feature is helpful if you need to tell emergency personnel your location.

From the map, select the vehicle.

Finding emergency services and fuel

You can use the Where Am I? page to find the nearest hospitals, police stations, and fuel stations.

- 1 From the map, select the vehicle.
- 2 Select Hospitals, Police Station, Motorway Services or Petrol Stations.

NOTE: some service categories are not available in all areas.

NOTE: when a lorry vehicle profile is active, an option for motorway services appears instead of fuel.

A list of locations for the selected service appears, with the nearest locations at the top.

Getting directions to your current location

Trip Data: displays customisable trip data, such as speed or mileage (*Viewing trip data from the map*, page 31).

Turns: displays a list of upcoming turns in your route (*Viewing turns and directions*, page 15).

Phone: displays a list of recent phone calls from your connected phone and displays in-call options while a phone call is active (*Using in-call options*, page 35).

Weather: displays weather conditions for your area.

photoLive: displays live traffic cameras from your photoLive subscription (photoLive traffic cameras, page 37).

Report Camera: allows you to report a speed or red light camera. This tool is available only when you have speed or red light camera data on your device and you have an active connection to the dezl app.

Garmin eLog: displays hours of service information from the Garmin eLog[™] app. Allows you to change duty status while you are not driving.

PrePass ®: shows notifications for upcoming weighbridges and bypass decisions (*PrePass*®, page 41).

Viewing a map tool

- 1 From the map, select :.
- 2 Select a map tool.

The map tool appears in a panel at the edge of the map.

3 When you have finished using the map tool, select X.

Up ahead

The Up Ahead tool provides information about upcoming locations along your route or the road on which you are travelling. You can view upcoming points of interest by category, such as restaurants, fuel stations or roadside services.

You can customise the categories that show in the Up Ahead tool.

Viewing upcoming locations

1 From the map, select > Up Ahead.

While you are travelling, the map tool shows the next location along your road or route.

 - If the map tool shows upcoming locations, select a location to view location details or start a route to the location.

Customising the up ahead categories

You can change the location categories that appear in the Up Ahead tool.

Towns Ahead

While you are travelling on a highway or navigating a route that includes a highway, the Towns Ahead tool provides information about upcoming towns along the highway. For each town, the map tool shows the distance to the highway exit and the services available, similar to the information on highway road signs.

Viewing Upcoming Towns and Exit Services

- 1 From the map, select > Towns Ahead.
 - While you are travelling along a highway or an active route, the map tool shows information about upcoming towns and exits.
- 2 Select a town.
 - The device shows a list of points of interest located at the selected town exit, such as fuel stations, lodging or restaurants.

Customising the map

Customising the map layers

You can customise which data appears on the map, such as icons for points of interest and road conditions.

- 1 Select Settings > Map and Vehicle > Map Layers.
- 2 Select the layers to include on the map, and select **Save**.

Changing the map data field

- From the map, select a data field.
 NOTE: you cannot customise Speed.
- 2 Select a type of data to display.

Changing the map perspective

- 1 Select Settings > Map and Vehicle > Driving Map View.
- 2 Select an option:
 - Select **Track Up** to display the map in two dimensions (2-D), with your direction of travel at the top.
 - Select **North Up** to display the map in 2-D with north at the top.
 - · Select **3-D** to display the map in three dimensions.
- 3 Select Save.

Live services, traffic and smartphone features

The dezl app allows your device to receive smart notifications and live information, such as live traffic data and weather information.

Live traffic data: sends real-time traffic data to your device, such as traffic incidents and delays, construction zones and road closings (*Traffic*, page 36).

Weather information: sends real-time weather forecasts, road conditions and weather radar to your device (*Viewing the weather forecast*, page 55).

Smart Notifications: displays phone notifications and messages on your device. This feature is not available for all languages.

Hands-Free calling: allows you to make and receive phone calls using your device, and allows you to use the device as a hands-free speaker phone. If the selected language supports the voice command feature, you can place calls using voice commands.

Send locations to device: allows you to send locations from your smartphone to your navigation device.

Pairing with Your Smartphone

You can pair your deel device with your smartphone and the deel app to enable additional features and access live information (*Live services, traffic and smartphone features*, page 32).

- 1 From the app store on your smartphone, install the dezl app.
- 2 Turn on your dezl device and place the device and your smartphone within 3 m (10 ft.) of each other.
- 3 On your phone, open the dezl app.
- **4** Follow the on-screen instructions to sign in to a Garmin account and complete the pairing and setup process.

The main app dashboard appears. After the devices are paired, they connect automatically when they are turned on and within range.

Tips after pairing the devices

- · After the initial pairing, the two devices can connect automatically each time you turn them on.
- · When your phone is connected to your device, you are ready to receive voice calls.
- · When you turn on the device, it tries to connect to the last phone to which it was connected.
- You might need to set your phone to connect to the device automatically when the device is turned on.
- To place phone calls, the contact sharing permission must be enabled for the navigation device in the Bluetooth settings on your phone.
- You should verify that the Bluetooth features you want to use are enabled (*Enabling or Disabling Bluetooth Features*, page 35).

Pairing Additional Bluetooth Devices

- 1 Place your headset or phone and your Bluetooth device within 33 ft. (10 m) of each other.

As you type, suggestions appear below the search field.

The app displays the location on a map.

4 Select Go! to start a route.

The delation and the location is added to your recent searches in the Where To? menu.

Smart Notifications

While your device is connected to the dezl app, you can view notifications from your smartphone on your dezl device, such as text messages, incoming calls, and calendar appointments.

Receiving notifications

↑ WARNING

Do not read or reply to notifications while driving. If you do so, you could become distracted by the display, which could lead to an accident causing serious personal injury or death.

Before you can use this feature, your device must be connected to a supported phone running the dezl app.

From most pages, a pop-up appears when the device receives a notification from your smartphone. If the device is moving, you must verify you are a passenger and not the driver before you can view notifications.

NOTE: if you are viewing the map, notifications appear in a map tool.

- · To ignore a notification, select **OK**.
 - The pop-up closes, but the notification remains active on your phone.
- To view a notification, select View.
- To listen to the notification, select View > Play.
 - The device reads the notification using text-to-speech technology. This feature is not available for all languages.
- To perform additional actions, such as dismissing the notification from your phone, select **View**, and select an option.

NOTE: additional actions are available for only some notification types and must be supported by the app generating the notification.

Hands-free calling

NOTE: while most phones and headsets are supported and can be used, a particular phone or headset cannot be guaranteed to be compatible. All features may not be available for your phone.

In-call options appear when you answer a call. Some options may not be compatible with your phone.

Saving a Phone Number as a Preset

You can save up to three contacts as presets on the dial pad. This allows you to quickly call your home phone number, family members, or frequently called contacts.

- 2 Hold a preset number, such as Preset 1.
- Select a contact.

Wireless Headsets

Your device can send audio navigation prompts to a Bluetooth-enabled wireless headset.

Enabling or Disabling Bluetooth Features

You can enable or disable hands-free calling and dezl features for your paired smartphone.

- 1 Select Settings > Wireless Networks > Bluetooth.
- 2 Select next to your phone name.
- 3 In the **Use for** section, select an option:
 - · To enable a connection to the dezl app, select dezl.
 - · To enable hands-free calling features, select Hands-Free.
- 4 Select OK.

Showing or hiding app notifications (Android™)

You can use the dezl app to customise which types of smartphone notifications appear on your dezl device.

A list of your smartphone apps appears.

3 Select the toggle switch next to an app to enable or disable notifications for the app.

Showing or hiding notification categories for your Apple device

If you are connected to an Apple device, you can filter the notifications shown on your dezl device by showing or hiding categories.

Disconnecting a Bluetooth device

You can temporarily disconnect a Bluetooth device without deleting it from the paired devices list. The Bluetooth device can connect to your dezl device automatically in the future.

- 3 Select OK.

Deleting a paired Bluetooth device

Traffic

NOTICE

Garmin is not responsible for the accuracy or timeliness of the traffic information.

Your device can provide information about traffic on the road ahead or on your route. You can set your device to avoid traffic when calculating routes, and to find a new route to your destination if a large traffic delay occurs on your active route (*Traffic Settings*, page 58). The traffic map allows you to browse the map for traffic delays in your area.

To provide traffic information, your device must be receiving traffic data.

• All product models can receive subscription-free traffic data using the dezl app (Receiving traffic data using your smartphone, page 36).

Traffic data is not available in all areas. For information about traffic coverage areas, go to garmin.com/traffic.

Receiving traffic data using your smartphone

Your device can receive subscription-free traffic data while connected to a smartphone running the dezl app.

photoLive traffic cameras provide live images of traffic conditions on major roads and junctions.

The photoLive service is not available in all areas.

You can view live images from nearby traffic cameras. You can also save traffic cameras for areas you travel frequently.

A preview of the live image from the camera appears next to a map of the camera's location. You can select the image preview to view the full-sized image.

A thumbnail image preview of the camera is added to the main screen of the photoLive app.

Break planning

NOTICE

This device by itself is NOT an approved substitute for logbook recording requirements under US Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) regulations. Drivers should comply with all applicable hours-of-service requirements. When integrated with a Garmin eLog compliant Electronic Logging Device (ELD), this device enables a motor carrier to comply with hours of service logging and break requirements. For more information, or to purchase a Garmin eLog device, go to garmin.com/elog.

When the break planning feature is enabled, the device notifies you one hour before suggested break times and drive hour limits and suggests break locations on your route. You can use this feature to keep track of your working hours, which may help you comply with safety regulations.

NOTE: break planning features are not available when using the car vehicle profile.

Taking a suggested break

When it is time for a break, the device notifies you and displays suggested break location POIs along your route. Select a POI from the list of suggested break locations.

The device adds the break location as the next destination on your route.

Starting the break timer

The break timer starts automatically when the vehicle is moving at least 5 mph (8 kph) for 30 seconds. You can start the timer manually at any time.

NOTE: this feature is not available in all areas.

Before you can use this feature, a lorry vehicle profile must be active.

You can record data needed for International Fuel Tax Agreement documentation (IFTA), such as fuel-purchase data and miles driven.

Entering fuel data

- 1 Select : > IFTA > At the Pump.
- 2 Enter the fuel price per gallon.
- 3 Select the Fuel Used field.
- 4 Enter the amount of fuel purchased.
- 5 If necessary, select the fuel type:
 - To record the amount in litres, select Gallons > Litres > Save.
 - To record the amount in gallons, select Litres > Gallons > Save.
- 6 If necessary, select the Tax Included tick box.
- 7 Select Next.
- **8** Select an option to record the fuel station where you refuelled:
 - · Select a nearby fuel station from the list.
 - · Select the text field, and enter the fuel station name and address.
- **9** Select the fuel purchaser.

Editing fuel data

- 1 Select > IFTA > Fuel Journals.
- 2 If necessary, select a vehicle profile.
- 3 If necessary, select a quarter.
- 4 Select a fuel record.
- 5 Select an option:
 - · Select a field to edit the information.
 - Select in to delete the record.

Viewing and Exporting a Jurisdiction Summary

The jurisdiction summary lists data for every area in which your vehicle has operated during each quarter. The jurisdiction summary is available in some areas.

- 1 Select :> IFTA > Jurisdiction Summary.
- 2 If necessary, select a lorry.
- 3 If necessary, select a quarter.
- 4 Select = > Export > OK to export a jurisdiction summary.

The device exports the summary to a .csv file and stores it in the Reports folder on the device.

Editing and exporting trip reports

- 1 From the main menu, select > IFTA > Trip Reports.
- 2 If necessary, select a lorry.
- 3 If necessary, select a quarter.
- 4 Select a report.
- 5 Select an option:
 - Select = > **Delete**, and select the tick box to delete a report.
 - Select \longrightarrow > **Combine**, and select the tick boxes to combine reports.
 - Select > Export > OK. The device exports the report to a .csv file and stores it in the Reports folder on the device.

Viewing Exported Jurisdiction Summaries and Trip Reports

PrePass¹

NOTICE

Garmin is not responsible for the accuracy or timeliness of the information provided by the PrePass app.

NOTE: Before you can use this feature, you must have an active PrePass account.

The PrePass app enables drivers to verify the safety, credentials, and weight of a commercial vehicle with upcoming weigh stations. You can pair your device with the device app and the PrePass app to receive upcoming weigh station notifications on your device.

NOTE: This feature is available only in the United States.

Loyalty Programmes

From your dēzl device, you can access loyalty programmes from some of the travel plazas in the United States, including Love's Travel Stops® and Pilot Flying J Travel Centers®. You can use the loyalty programme apps on your dēzl device to check reward points balances and other loyalty programme information. To activate loyalty programme features, sign in to your loyalty programme account in the dēzl app.

NOTE: this feature is available only in the United States.

Garmin eLog

The Garmin eLog adapter enables a motor carrier to comply with FMCSA Electronic Logging Device (ELD) regulations. When the dēzl device is paired with the Garmin eLog adapter, the dēzl device and the Garmin eLog adapter together provide a complete ELD solution without the need for an additional smartphone or mobile device. You can use your dēzl device to record and view hours of service information, change your duty status, create inspection reports, and more.

The Garmin eLog adapter is not available in all areas. For more information, or to purchase a Garmin eLog adapter, go to garmin.com/elog.

Setting Up Your Garmin eLog Adapter

NOTE: If you need to transfer Garmin eLog data from another device to your dēzl device, you must import the data during the setup process. You should create a data backup from your previous device before you start setting up the Garmin eLog adapter on your dēzl device (*Transferring Garmin eLog Data from Another Device*, page 41).

You must set up and pair your Garmin eLog adapter with the Garmin eLog app in order to be in compliance with FMCSA ELD regulations. For more information about installing the Garmin eLog adapter in your vehicle, see the *Garmin eLog Owner's Manual* at garmin.com/manuals/elog.

- 1 On your dezl device, open the Garmin eLog app.
- 2 Follow the instructions in the app to set up and configure the Garmin eLog system, administrator account, and driver profiles.

NOTICE

The administrator account is critical for some app functions. Choose an administrator password you can remember, and do not lose the password. The administrator password cannot be recovered without clearing all app data, which causes all recorded Garmin eLog data to be deleted.

NOTE: Until you complete the setup process, the Garmin eLog device has limited functionality and is not compliant with FMCSA ELD regulations.

Transferring Garmin eLog Data from Another Device

If you have previously used your Garmin eLog adapter with another device, you can transfer the Garmin eLog app data from the previous device to your dēzl device. You must complete this transfer during the initial setup.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app on your previous device, create a data backup (Backing Up Data, page 42).
- 2 While setting up your Garmin eLog adapter with your device, restore the data backup (*Restoring Data*, page 42).

Backing Up Data

You can back up your recorded data to a USB storage device. You should back up regularly to help prevent data loss. This is also useful when you need to transfer data to another device.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select Settings > Back Up Data.
- 2 Insert a USB storage device into the USB port on the Garmin eLog adapter.
 The light ring on the adapter glows green and plays a tone when it is ready to back up data.
- 3 Select Back Up Data.

Restoring Data

You can restore backed up data from a USB storage device. This can be useful when transferring Garmin eLog app data from another device.

NOTE: You can restore backed up data only while your are setting up the Garmin eLog app.

- 1 Open the Garmin eLog app to start the setup process.
- 2 Follow the on-screen instructions to install the Garmin eLog adapter in the vehicle diagnostic port and complete the pairing process.
- 3 Select Restore from Backup.
- 4 Insert a USB storage device containing backup files into the USB port on the Garmin eLog adapter. The light ring on the adapter glows green and plays a tone when it is ready to restore data.
- 5 Select a backup file.
- 6 Select Restore.

Daily Operation Guidelines

The following points are guidelines to follow when using the Garmin eLog system. Your motor carrier may have different operation requirements. Follow your motor carrier's recommendations for daily operation.

- Verify the dezl is securely mounted in the vehicle and its screen is visible from a normal seated position.
- Verify Bluetooth wireless technology and location services are enabled on your device at all times while using the Garmin eLog adapter.
- Verify the Garmin eLog app is running and the Garmin eLog adapter is secured to the vehicle diagnostic port before starting the vehicle.
- · Log in to the Garmin eLog app at the start of each day.
- Review and claim all logs recorded for an unidentified driver, if applicable.
- At the end of each work day, log out of the Garmin eLog app after turning off the engine.
- Certify your records, and submit them to your motor carrier at the end of each day (Certifying Daily Logs, page 47).

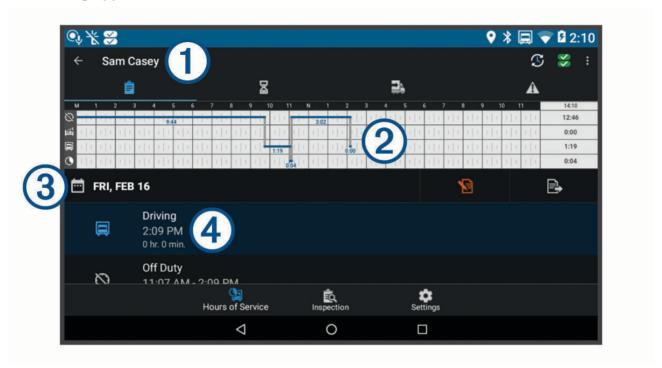
Starting a Drive

Each time you drive your vehicle, you should complete these actions to ensure your hours of service information is recorded correctly.

- 1 Verify the Garmin eLog adapter is secured to the vehicle diagnostic port.

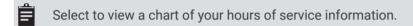

Garmin eLog Map Tool Overview

The Garmin eLog map tool appears on the navigation map automatically while your device is connected to a Garmin eLog adapter. If you close the map tool, you can open it manually by selecting : > Garmin eLog from the map.

As you drive, the device displays your duty status and hours of service information in the Garmin eLog map tool.



- Diagnostic and malfunction indicator. Select to view detailed information about diagnostic or malfunction alerts (*Viewing Diagnostics and Malfunctions*, page 49).
- Driver name and duty status. Select to change the driver's duty status (*Changing Duty Status*, page 46). **NOTE:** You cannot change your duty status while driving.
- (3) Current remaining drive hours. Select to view detailed drive hours information in the Garmin eLog app.

Driving in a Team

If you are driving in a team, you can switch between active drivers at any time. Each driver must log in to the Garmin eLog app before they can be set as the active driver.



From the Garmin eLog app, select the icon 1 next to the user who should be listed as the active driver.

Changing Duty Status

For the most accurate records, you must change your duty status in the Garmin eLog app every time you change your driving status, such as when you start driving, take a break, switch drivers, or change the type of driving you are doing. The Garmin eLog adapter automatically switches to driving status when the vehicle's diagnostic port reports a speed greater than or equal to five miles per hour. The vehicle is stopped when the diagnostic port reports a speed of zero miles per hour.

NOTE: The vehicle must be stopped to change duty status. You cannot manually change duty status while you are driving.

- 1 Select an option:
 - From the Garmin eLog app, select \mathfrak{S} .
 - From the Garmin eLog map tool, select the driver name.
- 2 Select an option:

NOTE: The Personal Conveyance and Yard Moves options are available only if the administrator has enabled them for your driver profile (*Editing a Driver Profile*, page 52).

- If you are on duty, select **On Duty**.
- · If you are off duty, select Off Duty.
- · If you are on duty and driving, select **Driving**.
- If you are moving to the sleeper berth, select Sleeper Berth.
- If you are using the vehicle for personal conveyance, select **Personal Conveyance**.
- If you are moving the vehicle within the yard, select Yard Moves.

Editing a Duty Status Record

You can update individual duty status entries to make corrections or updates to your duty status history as allowed by FMCSA regulations. This can be useful if you forget to change your duty status.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select the duty status record for the affected time period.
- 2 Select Duty Status.
- 3 Select the correct duty status for the time period.
- 4 If necessary, update the start and end times for the duty status entry.
- 5 If necessary, enter the location where this duty status was active.
- 6 Enter an annotation describing the reason for the change.
- 7 Select Save.

Viewing Hours of Service

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select HOS.
- 2 Select an option:
 - To view a chart of your hours of service information, select .
 TIP: You can select the chart to view a larger image of your information.

Recording Adverse Conditions

If you require a time extension because of adverse conditions, you can add a two-hour extension to your hours for the day.

From the Garmin eLog app, select > Record Adverse Conditions > Yes.

Reviewing Logs

The Garmin eLog app keeps track of logs that may require review, including logs that have been edited or logs that exist for an unidentified driver. When a driver logs in, the app prompts them to review logs that contain an unidentified driver, if any are available. Drivers are responsible for reviewing and claiming logs, if applicable.

- 1 Select HOS > 1.
- 2 Select a log.
- 3 Select an option:
 - · If the log applies to you and your hours of service, select Accept.
 - · If the log does not apply to you, select **Decline**.

Certifying Daily Logs

After you are finished driving for the day, you should certify your daily log. If you update your duty status after certifying it, you must certify it again.

From the Garmin eLog app, select > Agree.

Submitting a Daily Log

You can submit a daily log to your motor carrier.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select 🖦
- 2 Select an option to share your exported log.

Exporting and Saving a Record of Duty Status (RODS) Report

You can create a RODS report so you or your motor carrier can open your records of duty status outside of the Garmin eLog app.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select > Create RODS Report.
- 2 If necessary, select Create Additional Graph Grid Report to include a graph grid in your RODS report.
- 3 Select an option:
 - · To save the report to the internal storage of your device, select Save Report.
 - To export the report to email, select Export Report.

Recording Trailers and Shipments

You can use the Garmin eLog app to keep records of trailers and shipments.

- 1 Select Vehicle > 2.
- 2 Select an option:
 - · To add a trailer, select Add Trailer.
 - · To add a shipment, select Add Shipment.
- 3 Enter the trailer number or shipping document number.

Roadside Inspection

Viewing Inspection Information

An authorized safety official may ask to view all information recorded by the Garmin eLog system for the current 24-hour period and any of the previous seven consecutive days. You can view this information on the Garmin eLog app at any time.

From the Garmin eLog app, select Inspection.

Transferring Data to an Inspector Using a USB Device

You can transfer data to a USB mass storage device to provide it to an authorized safety official. The Garmin eLog adapter supports USB mass storage devices formatted using the FAT32 file system.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select Inspection.
- 2 Select ↑ > Yes.
- **3** If necessary, enter an annotation.
- 4 Select USB.
- **5** Connect a USB mass storage device to the USB port on your Garmin eLog adapter.

The adapter glows green when it is ready to send the inspection report.

- 6 Enter your password.
- 7 Select Send to USB Device.

The Garmin eLog app notifies you when the transfer is complete.

8 Remove the USB mass storage device from the adapter.

Transferring Data to an Inspector Using Bluetooth Wireless Technology

The inspector's device must support the Bluetooth Personal Area Networking (PAN) profile and must be able to connect to FMCSA Web Services to complete transfers using Bluetooth wireless technology. Ensure that Bluetooth wireless technology and a Wi-Fi hotspot are enabled on the inspector's mobile device.

The Garmin eLog device uses the inspector's mobile device as a network access point to send inspection information to FMCSA web services.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select **Inspection**.
- 2 Select \uparrow > Yes.
- 3 If necessary, enter an annotation.
- 4 Select Bluetooth.
- 5 Select Enable Pairing Mode.
- 6 Follow the on-screen instructions in the app to pair the Garmin eLog adapter with the inspector's mobile device

The inspection report transfers automatically after the pairing process is complete.

Diagnostics and Malfunctions

The Garmin eLog app records malfunctions and diagnostic events when the app detects critical functions that do not conform to Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) specifications. When a malfunction is detected, the driver and motor carrier are subject to responsibilities as directed by FMCSA guidelines.

Driver Responsibilities

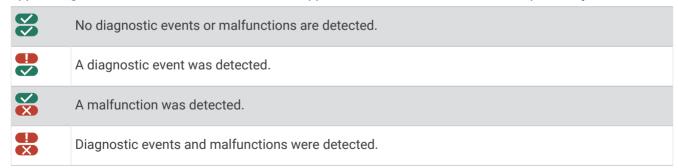
- The driver must note the malfunction of the ELD and provide written notice of the malfunction to the motor carrier within 24 hours.
- The driver must reconstruct the Record of Duty Status (RODS) for the current 24-hour period and the previous 7 consecutive days, and record the records of duty status on graph-grid paper logs that comply with 49 CFR 395.8, unless the driver already has the records or retrieves them from the ELD.
- The driver must continue to manually prepare RODS in accordance with 49 CFR 395.8 until the ELD is serviced and returned to a compliant status.

Motor Carrier Responsibilities

- The motor carrier must correct, repair, replace, or service the malfunctioning ELD within eight days of discovering the condition or a driver's notification to the motor carrier, whichever occurs first.
- The motor carrier must require the driver to maintain a paper RODS record until the ELD is back in service.

Viewing Diagnostics and Malfunctions

If the Garmin eLog adapter detects a diagnostic event or malfunction, an alert and an indicator appear in the app. A diagnostic and malfunction indicator also appears in the status bar or near the top of every screen.



You can view information about these alerts at any time. This can be useful for correcting errors or adjusting driver information.

Select the diagnostic or malfunction indicator.

The app displays information about the diagnostic or malfunction alert and provides recommendations for how to correct it.

Diagnostic Definitions

Power Data Diagnostic Event: The adapter did not receive power, or was not fully functional, for a period of time.

- 1 Check the vehicle diagnostic port connections.
- 2 Verify the adapter is firmly plugged into the vehicle diagnostic port.
- 3 Review all affected driver logs for missing or incorrect data.

Engine Synchronization Data Diagnostic Event: The adapter failed to synchronize with the vehicle engine computer to record required engine data for driver logs.

- 1 Check the vehicle diagnostic port connections.
- 2 Verify the adapter is firmly plugged into the vehicle diagnostic port.
- 3 Review all affected driver logs for missing or incorrect data.

Missing Required Data Elements Data Diagnostic Event: The Garmin eLog system failed to obtain one or more required data elements when recording driver logs.

- 1 Check the vehicle diagnostic port connections.
- 2 Verify the adapter is firmly plugged into the vehicle diagnostic port.
- 3 Check the Bluetooth settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app, and verify the device and the adapter are connected.
- 4 Check the GPS settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app, and verify the device settings allow location positions to be shared with the Garmin eLog app.
- 5 Review all affected driver logs for missing or incorrect data.

Data Transfer Data Diagnostic Event: A failure occurred with the method for transferring roadside inspection reports.

Perform the following actions:

- 1 Check the Bluetooth settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app, and verify the device and the adapter are connected.
- 2 Verify all USB storage devices used to transfer roadside inspection reports are operating correctly.
- If you have not performed a data backup within the previous seven days, back up your recorded Garmin eLog data to a USB storage device.

Unidentified Driving Records Data Diagnostic Event: At least 30 minutes of unidentified driving was recorded within the current 24 hour period, and over the previous 7 days.

- · Drivers: Review and claim the unidentified driving time.
- · Administrator: Review and assign the unidentified driving time to the respective drivers.

Malfunction Definitions

Power Compliance Malfunction: The adapter did not receive power, or was not fully functional, for a period of time. At least 30 minutes of driving time may not have been correctly recorded across all drivers over the past 24 hours.

- 1 Check the vehicle diagnostic port connections.
- 2 Verify the adapter is firmly plugged into the vehicle diagnostic port.
- 3 Review all affected driver logs for missing or incorrect data.

Engine Synchronization Compliance Malfunction: The adapter failed to synchronize with the vehicle engine computer to record required engine data for driver logs. At least 30 minutes of inaccurate data may have been recorded across all drivers over the past 24 hours.

- 1 Check the vehicle diagnostic port connections.
- 2 Verify the adapter is firmly plugged into the vehicle diagnostic port.
- 3 Review all affected driver logs for missing or incorrect data.

Timing Compliance Malfunction: The Garmin eLog system failed to accurately verify the calendar date or time of day required for driver logs.

- 1 Verify the adapter is firmly plugged into the vehicle diagnostic port.
- 2 Check the Bluetooth settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app, and verify the device and the adapter are connected.
- 3 Check the date and time settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app.
- 4 Review all affected driver logs for missing or incorrect data.

Positioning Compliance Malfunction: The Garmin eLog system failed to acquire valid location positions required for driver logs. At least 60 minutes of inaccurate data may have been recorded across all drivers over the past 24 hours.

- 1 Verify the Garmin eLog app is running and a driver is logged in when driving the vehicle.
- 2 Check the Bluetooth settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app, and verify the device and the adapter are connected.
- 3 Check the GPS settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app, and verify the device settings allow location positions to be shared with the Garmin eLog app.
- 4 Review all affected driver logs for missing or incorrect data.

Data Recording Compliance Malfunction: The Garmin eLog system has reached the maximum storage capacity for driver logs and cannot store or retrieve more logs.

- 1 Create a RODS report for each driver for record keeping (Exporting and Saving a Record of Duty Status (RODS) Report, page 48).
- 2 Log in as an administrator.
- 3 Back up the system data (Backing Up Data, page 42).
- 4 Remove unneeded files from the storage of the device running the Garmin eLog app.

Data Transfer Compliance Malfunction: Multiple failures occurred with the method for transferring roadside inspection reports.

Perform the following actions:

- 1 Check the Bluetooth settings on the device running the Garmin eLog app, and verify the device and the adapter are connected.
- Verify all USB storage devices used to transfer roadside inspection reports are operating correctly and are formatted using the FAT32 file system.
- 3 If you have not performed a data backup within the previous seven days, back up your recorded Garmin eLog data to a USB storage device.

Adapter Firmware Malfunction: A serious error occurred attempting to update the adapter firmware. Contact Garmin customer support for further help.

Outdated adapter firmware may not maintain compliance. Garmin recommends keeping paper logs until the adapter firmware is successfully updated.

Administrator Functions

NOTICE

The administrator account is critical for some app functions. Choose an administrator password you can remember, and do not lose the password. The administrator password cannot be recovered without clearing all app data, which causes all recorded Garmin eLog data to be deleted.

You must use the administrator account to perform some Garmin eLog app functions, including adding driver profiles, editing driver profiles, and resetting driver passwords. The administrator account and password are created during the initial Garmin eLog app setup. If the app is administered by a company, drivers may not have access to the administrator functions.

Adding Driver Profiles

You must log in as an administrator to add driver profiles.

- 1 From the Garmin eLog app, select Add Driver.
- 2 Enter the administrator password.
- 3 Enter the driver and motor carrier information.
- 4 If the driver has an exempt status, select Exempt Driver.
- 5 If the driver is allowed to use the vehicle for personal conveyance, select Allow Personal Conveyance.
- 6 If the driver is allowed to make yard moves, select Allow Yard Moves.
- 7 Select Save.

The first time the driver logs into the new profile, the app prompts the driver to enter their driver license number and create a password.

Editing a Driver Profile

An administrator can edit driver profiles to change driver privileges, reset profile passwords, or deactivate profiles.

NOTE: The administrator can edit basic driver information in the driver profile, but the Garmin eLog app does not support editing duty status records from the administrator account. To correct a duty status record, the driver must log in to the driver profile and edit the record (*Editing a Duty Status Record*, page 47).

- 1 Log in to an administrator account.
- 2 Select a driver profile.
- 3 Select > Edit Profile.
- 4 Select an option:
 - · To edit driver information, select a field to update it.
 - To reset the profile password, select Reset Password.
 - To deactivate the profile, select Deactivate Profile.

Clearing Garmin eLog App Data

NOTICE

Clearing the Garmin eLog app data will cause all retained ELD data to be deleted from your deleted levice. It is the responsibility of the driver and/or motor carrier to ensure ELD records are retained as required by applicable regulations.

You can clear the Garmin eLog app data to restore the app to the original factory state. This requires you to set up your Garmin eLog adaptor, administrator account, and all driver profiles again. Clearing the app data is also the only way to reset a lost or forgotten administrator password.

- 1 Log in to a driver or administrator account, and back up all data (Backing Up Data, page 42).
- 2 Wait for the backup to complete.
- 3 From the home screen, select Settings > Device > Apps > eLog > Storage.
- 4 Select Clear Data.

Voice Command

NOTE: voice command is not available for all languages and regions, and may not be available on all models.

NOTE: Voice Activated Navigation may not achieve desired performance when in a noisy environment.

Voice command allows you to use your device by saying words and commands. The voice command menu provides voice prompts and a list of available commands.

Tips for Speaking to the Device

- · Speak in a clear voice directed at the device.
- · Start each request with OK, Garmin.
- Reduce background noise, such as voices or the radio, to help the device interpret your commands more accurately.
- · Respond to voice prompts from the device as needed.
- If you do not receive a useful response, try rephrasing your request.
- If the device does not respond to your requests, verify that it is not placed near a speaker or air vent, which can produce noise that interferes with the microphone.

Launching Garmin Voice-Activated Navigation

Garmin voice-activated navigation allows you to use requests spoken in plain language to search for locations and addresses, start routes with turn-by-turn directions, place hands-free phone calls and more.

· Say OK, Garmin, and make a spoken request.

For example, you can say phrases like these:

- OK Garmin, take me home.
- OK Garmin, where's the library?

Checking Your Arrival Time

While a route is active, you can say a phrase to check your estimated time of arrival at your destination. Say *OK Garmin, what time will we arrive?*.

Placing a Phone Call Using Your Voice

You can use a voice command to call a contact from the phone book of your paired smartphone.

Say OK Garmin, call, and say the contact name.

For example, you can say OK Garmin, call Mum..

Changing Device Settings Using Your Voice

You can say phrases like these to set device settings to a value from 0 to 10.

- · OK Garmin, increase the volume.
- · OK Garmin, set the volume to 0.
- · OK Garmin, set the volume to 9.

Viewing the Owner's Manual on Your Device

You can view the complete owner's manual on the device screen in many languages.

- 1 Select > Tools > Owner's Manual.
 - The owner's manual appears in the same language as the software text (Setting the Text Language, page 59).
- 2 Select \mathbf{Q} to search the owner's manual (optional).

Viewing the lorry map

The lorry map highlights recognised lorry routes on the map, such as the Surface Transportation Assistance Act (STAA) preferred routes, TruckDown® (TD) preferred routes, and non-radioactive hazardous materials (NRHM) routes. The recognised routes vary based on your area and the map data loaded on your device.

Select > dēzl > Lorry Map.

Trip planner

You can use the trip planner to create and save a trip, which you can navigate later. This can be useful for planning a delivery route, a vacation, or a road trip. You can edit a saved trip to further customise it, including reordering locations, optimising the order of stops, adding suggested attractions and adding shaping points. You can also use the trip planner to edit and save your active route.

Planning a trip

A trip can include many locations, and it must include at least a starting point and a destination. The starting point is the location from which you plan to start your trip. If you start navigating the trip from a different location, the device gives you the option to route to your starting point first. For a round trip, the starting location and final destination can be the same.

- 1 Select > dezl > Trip Planner > New Trip.
- 2 Select Select Start Location.
- 3 Choose a location for your starting point, and select **Select**.
- 4 Select Select Destination.
- 5 Choose a location for a destination, and select Select.
- 6 Select Add Location to add more locations (optional).
- 7 After you have added all the necessary locations, select Next > Save.
- 8 Enter a name and select Done.

Editing and reordering locations in a trip

- 1 Select > dezl > Trip Planner > Saved Trips.
- 2 Select a saved trip.
- 3 Select a location.
- 4 Select an option:
 - To move the location up or down, select **1**, and drag the location to a new position in the trip.
 - To add a new location after the selected location, select (+).
 - To remove the location, select x.

Optimising the order of stops in a trip

The device can automatically optimise the order of stops in your trip to create a shorter, more efficient route. The starting location and final destination are not changed when you optimise the order.

While editing a trip, select > Optimise Order.

Discovering Attractions Along Your Trip

The device can suggest interesting or popular attractions to add to your trip.

- 1 While editing a trip, select > Suggest Attractions.
- 2 Select an attraction to view more information.
- 3 Select **Select** to add the attraction to your trip.

Changing routing options for a trip

You can customise how the device calculates the route when you start your trip.

- 1 Select :> Trip Planner > Saved Trips.
- 2 Select a saved trip.
- 3 Select the vehicle profile icon, and select the vehicle you plan to use while navigating the trip (optional).
- 4 Select .
- 5 Select an option:
 - To add shaping points to your trip, select **Shape Route**, and follow the on-screen instructions (*Shaping Your Route*, page 17).
 - To change the calculation mode for the trip, select **Route Preference** (*Changing the route calculation mode*, page 17).

Navigating to a favourite trip

Before you can start navigating a saved trip, the active vehicle profile on the device must match the selected vehicle profile for the trip (*Changing routing options for a trip*, page 55). If it does not match, the device prompts you to change the vehicle profile before you can start the trip (*Switching the Vehicle Profile*, page 9).

- 1 Select > dezl > Trip Planner > Saved Trips.
- 2 Select a saved trip.
- 3 Select Go!.
- 4 Select the first location to navigate to, and select Start.

The device calculates a route from your current location to the selected location, and then it guides you to the remaining trip destinations in order.

Editing and saving your active route

If a route is active, you can use the trip planner to edit and save your route as a trip.

- 1 Select :> dezl > Trip Planner > Saved Trips > My Active Route.
- 2 Edit your route using any of the trip planner features.

The route recalculates each time you make a change.

3 Select Save to save your route as a trip, which you can navigate again later (optional).

Viewing Previous Routes and Destinations

Before you can use this feature, you must enable the travel history feature (Device settings, page 59).

You can view your previous routes and places where you have stopped on the map.

Select > dezl > Trip History.

Viewing the weather forecast

Before you can use this feature, your device must be receiving weather data. You can connect your device to the dezl app to receive weather data.

- 1 From the home screen, select the weather widget (*Home Screen*, page 7).

 The device shows the current weather conditions and a forecast for the next several days.
- 2 Select a day.

The detailed forecast for that day appears.

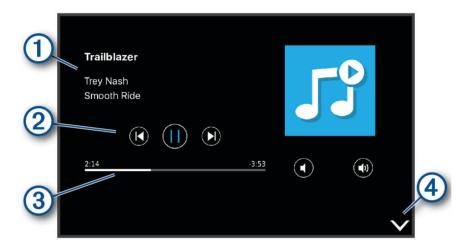

Media player

The media player allows your device to control the media currently playing from a media app on your paired phone. You can open the media player at any time by selecting > Tools > Media Player from the main menu.

Settings

Navigation settings

Select Settings > Navigation.

Calculation Mode: sets the route calculation method. **Avoidances**: sets road features to avoid on a route.

Custom Avoidances: allows you to avoid specific roads or areas.

Environmental Zones: sets the avoidance preferences for areas with environmental or emissions restrictions that may apply to your vehicle.

Toll Roads: sets the preferences for avoiding toll roads.

Tolls and Fees: sets the preferences for avoiding toll roads and toll stickers.

NOTE: this feature is not available in all areas.

Restricted Mode: disables all functions that require significant operator attention.

Travel History: allows the device to store a record of the places you go. This allows you to view the trip log, use the Trip History feature and use myTrends suggested routes.

Clear Travel History: allows you to clear all travel history from the device.

Map and vehicle settings

Auto Zoom: automatically selects the zoom level for optimal use of your map. When disabled, you must zoom in or out manually.

myMaps: sets which installed maps the device uses.

Enabling maps

You can enable map products installed on your device.

Connecting to a Wireless Network

Driver Assistance Settings

Select Settings > Driver Assistance.

Audible Driver Alerts: enables an audible alert for each type of driver alert (*Driver awareness features and alerts*, page 11).

Proximity Alerts: alerts you when you approach speed cameras or red light cameras.

Route Preview: shows a preview of the major roads in your route when you start navigation.

Break Planning: enables break planning features that monitor your driving time, suggest breaks and show upcoming services.

Traffic Settings

From the main menu, select Settings > Traffic.

Traffic: enables the traffic feature.

Current Provider: sets the traffic provider to use for traffic data. The Auto option selects the best available traffic data automatically.

Subscriptions: lists the current traffic subscriptions.

Optimise Route: enables the device to use optimised alternative routes automatically or upon request (*Avoiding traffic delays on your route*, page 18).

Traffic Alerts: sets the traffic delay severity for which the device displays a traffic alert.

Display settings

Select Settings > Device > Display.

Brightness Level: sets the display brightness level on your device.

Adaptive Brightness: automatically adjusts the backlight brightness based on the ambient light when the device is out of the mount.

Theme: allows you to select day or night colour mode. If you select the Automatic option, the device automatically switches to day or night colours based on the time of day.

Wallpaper: sets the wallpaper background on your device.

Sleep: allows you to set the amount of idle time before your device enters sleep mode while using battery power.

Daydream: enables or disables the daydream screen saver.

Font size: increases or decreases the font size on your device.

When device is rotated: enables the screen to rotate automatically between portrait and landscape display modes based on the device orientation or remain in the current orientation.

Sound and Notification Settings

Select Settings > Device > Sound & notification.

Volume Sliders: set the volume levels for navigation, media, calls, alarms, and notification alerts.

Do not disturb: sets the rules for the automatic do-not-disturb feature. This feature allows you to disable audible alerts during specific times or events.

Default notification ringtone: sets the default notification ringtone sound on your device.

Other sounds: allows you to enable or disable sounds for other device interactions, such as screen touches, screen locking or charging.

Cast: allows you to wirelessly send the device audio or video to a compatible speaker, display or device.

When device is locked: sets whether notifications appear on the screen while the device is locked.

App notifications: allows you to enable or disable notifications for each installed app and modify the do not disturb preferences for each app.

Regulatory: displays e-label regulatory and compliance information.

Garmin device information: displays hardware and software version information.

Device Data Reporting: shares anonymous data to improve the device.

Restoring settings

You can restore a category of settings to the factory default values.

 You can purchase an approved Garmin AC-DC adapter suitable for home or office use from a Garmin dealer or www.garmin.com. The device may charge slowly when connected to a third-party adapter.

Updating Maps and Software Using a Wi-Fi Network

NOTICE

Map and software updates may require the device to download large files. Regular data limits or charges from your internet service provider apply. Contact your internet service provider for more information about data limits or charges.

You can update the maps and software by connecting your device to a Wi-Fi network that provides access to the internet. This allows you to keep your device up to date without connecting it to a computer.

- 1 Using the included USB cable, connect the device to external power.
 - **NOTE:** a USB power adapter is not included. Go to the product page on garmin.com to purchase a power adapter accessory.
- 2 Connect the device to a Wi-Fi network (Connecting to a Wireless Network, page 57).
 - While connected to a Wi-Fi network, the device checks for available updates automatically and displays a notification when an update is available.
- 3 Select an option:
 - When an update notification appears, swipe down from the top of the screen, and select An update is available.
 - To manually check for updates, select **Settings** > **Updates**.

The device displays available map and software updates. When an update is available, **Update Available** appears below Map or Software.

- 4 Select an option:
 - To install all available updates, select **Download**.
 - · To install only map updates, select Map.
 - To install only software updates, select Software.
- 5 If necessary, read the licence agreements, and select Accept All to accept the agreements.
 - **NOTE**: if you do not agree with the licence terms, you can select Reject. This stops the update process. You cannot install updates until you accept the licence agreements.
- **6** Keep the device connected to external power and within range of the Wi-Fi network until the update process is complete.

TIP: if a map update is interrupted or cancelled before it completes, your device may be missing map data. To repair missing map data, you must update the maps again.

Updating Maps and Software with Garmin Express

You can use the Garmin Express application to download and install the latest map and software updates for your device.

- 1 If you do not have the Garmin Express application installed on your computer, go to garmin.com/express and follow the on-screen instructions to install it (*Installing Garmin Express*, page 63).
- 2 Open the Garmin Express application.
- 3 Connect your device to your computer using a micro-USB cable.

 The small end of the cable connects to the micro-USB port ① on your device, and the large end connects to an available USB port on your computer.



- 4 In the Garmin Express application, click **Add a Device**.

 The Garmin Express application searches for your device and displays the device name and serial number.
- 5 Click **Add Device** and follow the on-screen instructions to add your device to the Garmin Express application. When setup is complete, the Garmin Express application displays the updates available for your device.



- 6 Select an option:
 - To install all available updates, click Install All.
 - To install a specific update, click View Details and click Install next to the update you want.

The Garmin Express application downloads and installs the updates onto your device. Map updates are very large and this process may take a long time on slower internet connections.

NOTE: if a map update is too large for the internal storage of the device, the software may prompt you to install a microSD[®] card in your device to add storage space (*Installing a memory card for maps and data*, page 67).

7 Follow the on-screen instructions during the update process to finish installing updates.
For example, during the update process, the Garmin Express application may instruct you to disconnect and reconnect your device.

Installing Garmin Express

The Garmin Express application is available for Windows and Mac computers.

- 1 On your computer, go to garmin.com/express.
- 2 Select an option:
 - To view the system requirements and verify the Garmin Express application is compatible with your computer, select System Requirements.
 - To install on a Windows computer, select Download for Windows.
 - To install on a Mac computer, select Download for Mac.
- 3 Open the downloaded file, and follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.

Device Care

NOTICE

Avoid dropping your device.

Do not store the device where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur, as it can cause permanent damage.

Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touchscreen as this may result in damage.

Do not expose the device to water.

Cleaning the outer casing

NOTICE

Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

- 1 Clean the outer casing of the device (not the touchscreen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution.
- 2 Wipe the device dry.

Cleaning the Touchscreen

- 1 Use a soft, clean, lint-free cloth.
- 2 If necessary, lightly dampen the cloth with water.
- 3 If using a dampened cloth, turn off the device and disconnect the device from the power.
- 4 Gently wipe the screen with the cloth.

Avoiding theft

- · Remove the device and mount from sight when not in use.
- · Remove the residue left on the windscreen by the suction cup.
- Do not keep your unit in the glove compartment.
- Register your device using the Garmin Express software (garmin.com/express).

Resetting the device

You can reset your device if it stops functioning.

Hold the power key for 12 seconds.

Removing the Device, Mount and Suction Cup

Removing the Mount from the Suction Cup

- 1 Loosen the nut that secures the magnetic-powered mount to the suction cup ball.
- 2 Turn the device mount to the right or left.
- 3 Apply pressure until the socket on the mount releases the ball on the suction cup.

Removing the Suction Cup from the Windscreen

- 1 Flip the lever on the suction cup towards you.
- 2 Pull the tab on the suction cup towards you.

Troubleshooting

The suction cup will not stay on my windscreen

- 1 Clean the suction cup and windscreen with surgical spirit.
- 2 Dry with a clean, dry cloth.
- 3 Mount the suction cup (Mounting and Powering the Device in Your Vehicle, page 2).

The mount does not hold my device in place while I drive

For the best results, you should keep the vehicle mount clean and position the device close to the suction cup. If the device shifts position while you are driving, you should complete these actions.

- Remove the powered mount from the suction cup arm, and wipe the ball and socket with a cloth.
 Dust and other debris may reduce the friction in the ball and socket joint and allow the joint to shift while you are driving.
- Rotate the hinged arm toward the suction cup as far as your windshield angle allows.
 Positioning the device closer to the windshield reduces the effect of jarring and vibration from the road.

My device is not acquiring satellite signals

- · Verify the location services feature is enabled (Enabling or Disabling Location Services, page 59).
- Take your device out of car parks and away from tall buildings and trees.
- · Remain stationary for several minutes.

The device does not charge in my vehicle

- · Verify that the vehicle is turned on and is supplying power to the power outlet.
- Verify that the interior temperature of the vehicle is within the charging temperature range indicated in the specifications.
- In the vehicle fuse box, verify that the fuse for the vehicle power outlet is not broken.

My battery does not stay charged for very long

- Decrease the screen brightness (*Display settings*, page 58).
- Shorten the display timeout (Display settings, page 58).
- Decrease the volume (Adjusting Sound and Notification Volume, page 59).
- Turn off the Wi-Fi radio when it is not in use (Connecting to a Wireless Network, page 57).
- Put the device in power saving mode when not in use (Turning the device on or off, page 6).
- Keep your device away from extreme temperatures.
- · Do not leave your device in direct sunlight.

My device does not connect to my phone

- Select Settings > Bluetooth.
 - The Bluetooth option must be enabled.
- Enable Bluetooth wireless technology on your phone and bring your phone within 10 m (33 ft.) of the device.
- · Verify your phone is compatible.
 - Go to www.garmin.com/bluetooth for more information.
- · Complete the pairing process again.

To repeat the pairing process, you must unpair your phone and device (*Deleting a paired phone*, page 36) and complete the pairing process.

Backup Cameras

Your device can display the video feed from one or more connected backup cameras.

Pairing a BC™ 35 Backup Camera with a Garmin Navigation Device

You must enable the Wi-Fi setting on your Garmin navigation device before you can connect to a camera.

The BC 35 wireless backup camera is compatible with some Garmin navigation devices. Go to garmin.com /bc35 for more information about device compatibility.

You can pair up to four BC 35 wireless backup cameras with your compatible Garmin navigation device.

- 1 Update your navigation device to the latest software.
 - Your device may not support the BC 35 camera without the latest software. For more information about updating, see the owner's manual for your navigation device.
- 2 Turn on the Garmin navigation device, and bring it within 3 m (10 ft.) of the camera.
- 3 Select : > Tools > Rear View.
- 4 Select an option:
 - If this is the first camera you are connecting to the navigation device, select Add New Camera.
 - If this is an additional camera you are connecting to the navigation device, select : > Choose Camera > Add New Camera.
- 5 Follow the on-screen instructions.
 - **NOTE:** the pairing code or password is located on the transmitter or the camera.

After you complete the pairing process with a camera for the first time, it connects automatically to the Garmin navigation device.

Viewing the Backup Camera

Your device shows video from the connected backup camera in different ways, depending on how the camera is connected to power.

- 1 Select an option to show video:
 - If the camera is connected to a reverse lamp (recommended), place the vehicle into reverse. The device automatically shows video from the backup camera.
 - If the camera is connected to a steady power source, select > Tools > Rear View to manually view the camera.
- 2 Select an option to resume normal device operation:
 - If the camera is connected to a reverse lamp (recommended), take the vehicle out of reverse.

 The device automatically resumes normal operation.
 - If the transmitter is connected to a steady power source, select

 to manually hide the camera.

Switching Cameras

When multiple backup cameras are transmitting to your device, you can switch between the views from the cameras

- 1 Select : > Tools > Rear View.
- 2 Select : > Choose Camera.
- 3 Select a camera.

The video feed from the camera appears, and the camera name appears at the top of the screen.

Connecting a Dash Camera to the Powered Mount

Before you connect a dash camera to the powered mount, you should mount the dash camera device to your windscreen.

You can use the dezl device mount to power a compatible Garmin dash camera. This can be useful if you need to connect the dezl device and the dash camera to the same power source in your vehicle.

- 1 Mount the dezl device in your vehicle and connect it to power (*Mounting and Powering the Device in Your Vehicle*, page 2).
- 2 If necessary, remove the dezl device from the magnetic mount for a better view of the USB port.
- 3 Plug the dash camera's power cable into the USB port 1 on the mount.



Data management

The device has a memory card slot for additional data storage.

NOTE: the device is compatible with Windows 7 and newer, and Mac OS 10.7 and newer. Apple computers may require additional third-party software to read and write files.

About memory cards

You can purchase memory cards from an electronics supplier, or purchase pre-loaded Garmin mapping software (www.garmin.com). Memory cards can be used to store files such as maps and custom POIs.

Installing a memory card for maps and data

You can install a memory card to increase the storage space for maps and other data on your device. You can purchase memory cards from an electronics supplier, or go to www.garmin.com/maps to purchase a memory card with pre-loaded Garmin mapping software. The device supports microSD memory cards from 4 to 256 GB. Memory cards must use the FAT32 file system format. Memory cards greater than 32 GB must be formatted using the device (*Formatting the Memory Card*, page 67).

- 1 Locate the map and data memory card slot on your device (Device Overview, page 1).
- 2 Insert a memory card into the slot.
- 3 Press it in until it clicks.

Formatting the Memory Card

The device requires a memory card formatted using the FAT32 file system. You can use the device to format your card using this file system.

You must format a brand new memory card if it is not formatted using the FAT32 file system.

NOTE: formatting the memory card deletes all data on the card.

- 1 Select Settings > Device > Storage & USB.
- 2 Select your memory card.
- 3 Select > Settings > Format > ERASE & FORMAT.
- 4 Select Done.

Connecting the Device to Your Computer

You can connect the device to your computer using a USB cable.

- 1 Plug the small end of the USB cable into the port on the device.
- 2 Plug the larger end of the USB cable into a port on your computer.

Depending on your computer operating system, the device appears as either a portable device, a removable drive, or a removable volume.

Transferring data from your computer

- 1 Connect the device to your computer (Connecting the Device to Your Computer, page 67).
 Depending on your computer operating system, the device appears as either a portable device, a removable drive, or a removable volume.
- 2 On your computer, open the file browser.
- 3 Select a file.
- 4 Select Edit > Copy.
- **5** Browse to a folder on the device.

NOTE: for a removable drive or volume, you should not place files in the Garmin folder.

6 Select Edit > Paste.

Purchasing additional maps

- 1 Go to your device product page at garmin.com.
- 2 Click the Maps tab.
- 3 Follow the on-screen instructions.
